Individuals and Families Experiencing Homelessness

HIV/AIDS Resource Page – National Health Care for the Homeless Council	Resource page containing archives webinars, council resources, clinical tools, and additional online resources assembled by the National Health Care for the Homeless Council
Housing Opportunities for People Living with HIV/AIDS (HOPWA)	The Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) Program is the only Federal program dedicated to the housing needs of people living with HIV/AIDS. Under the HOPWA Program, HUD makes grants to local communities, States, and nonprofit organizations for projects that benefit low-income persons living with HIV/AIDS and their families.
HIV/AIDS Service Administration (HASA) Services (NYC Only)	HASA assists individuals living with AIDS or HIV illness to live healthier, more independent lives. The program can help clients with individualized service plans to target necessary benefits and provide support that is specific to their medical situation and that will enhance their well-being. HASA clients receive ongoing case management and are assigned to a caseworker at one of our HASA centers, located in all 5 boroughs.
CAMBA Housing Programs	CAMBA has provided emergency and transitional housing for people living with HIV/AIDS and their families for over 25 years. They have a strong relationship with New York City's HIV/AIDS Services Administration (HASA) and its three Brooklyn- based centers and have a deep understanding of HASA's benefits and housing placement process.
Iris House	Iris House was founded specifically for women living with HIV and their families. Over the last 25 years, their programs have diversified in their audience, but they still work to maintain a gender-specific approach to their work. Iris House offers support services such as Food & Nutrition Programs, Housing Programs, Behavioral Health Services, and Emotional Wellness Groups.
